# The journey.

Each person who walks through our doors brings with them a unique story. For many, their path to recovery wasn't easy and presented notable challenges. Yet, time and again, we witness insurmountable courage and perseverance. Here are three stories of Healing Transitions alumni who have risen to the challenge and are now fully embracing life in recovery.





Chassity reflects on her journey with a sense of awe. "I never imagined I'd be here," she says.

Raised in Comfort, North Carolina, Chassity faced many challenges growing up, including the loss of her mother at a young age and being introduced to opiates at 16, which is when her life began to spiral. After her sons were taken by Child Protective Services, she knew she had to change. At Healing Transitions, she found hope. "No matter how many times it takes, Healing Transitions will always be home."

Today, Chassity is thriving in recovery, reunited with her kids, and working as a dental assistant.

"I've been through more sober than I ever thought I could handle. And now, I handle it with grace."



### **MEET JASON**

Jason was 18 when he first experimented with cocaine and pain pills, sparking a years-long battle with addiction. A car wreck, arrests, and broken relationships followed, leading him to heroin and meth. His lowest point came when he overdosed in front of his son.

After jail and losing custody of his son, Jason hit rock bottom. A simple message from a Rapid Responder at Healing Transitions just checking in on him became the turning point for him. After his release, he found Healing Transitions. "They gave me a place to sit down and be still."

Jason is now in sustained recovery and cherishing time with his son. "I want people to know that you can come back from losing everything — a house, a car, a job, a child — everything."




